

Lenten Services

Sometimes it's hard to see Easter when Good Friday is staring you down. On that particular Friday, Jesus was publicly humiliated, beaten, hung on a cross for all to see. Easter? Who could have seen it coming? Good Friday is the day sin, death, and the devil had their way as Jesus cried out, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" Good Friday saw Jesus lose his life withal that is wrong with humanity on display.

That was Jesus' Good Friday, but if you think about it, we all know Good Friday in one way or another. It's the moment when death slaps you across the face and you realize that things will not be the same again. Our Good Friday's look like the circumstances in our lives that we wish we could change but simply cannot, no matter how hard we try. Our Good Fridays are characterized by brokenness, despair, guilt, and heartache.

The thing about Good Friday is that you can never get to Easter without it.

That's a hard thing to hear. The optimist in us may want to argue that we can have Easter without death and all that goes with it. You know, the coloring of eggs, the fancy hats and nice dresses, the family feast, the celebration and the pageantry. The amount of people at worship Easter Sunday as opposed to Good Friday is telling. Good Friday is ugly and hard. Easter Sunday is more to our liking.

The thing about Easter, however, is that you can never get there without Good Friday.

It's the beauty of the Christian faith. In a world that would rather get to the end than to walk thru the process, the church season slows us down so that we don't fool ourselves. Our faith compels us to name the truth about life, that it is both messy and delightful, sad and joyful, broken and redeemed.

The story of holy week brings us to terms with who we are...and who God us. I look forward to worshipping with you Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Killed and made alive. Crucified and risen. That is life, and that is the story of Easter.



For twenty years, Gregory Boyle has run Homeboy Industries, a gang intervention program located in the Boyle Heights neighborhood of Los Angeles, the gang capital of the world. In *Tattoos on the Heart*, he distills his experience working in the ghetto into a breathtaking series of parables inspired by faith. Arranged by theme and filled with sparkling humor and glowing generosity, these essays offer a stirring look at how full our lives could be if we could find the joy in loving others and in being loved unconditionally. From giant, tattooed Cesar, shopping at JCPenney fresh out of prison, we learn how to feel worthy of God's love. From ten-year-old Lula we learn the importance of being known and acknowledged. From Pedro we understand the kind of patience necessary to rescue someone from the darkness. In each chapter we benefit from Boyle's gentle, hard-earned wisdom.

These essays about universal kinship and redemption are moving examples of the power of unconditional love and the importance of fighting despair. Gorgeous and uplifting, *Tattoos on the Heart* reminds us that no life is less valuable than another.




