Worship at the Greenhouse

What an amazing event, "Worship at the Greenhouse" turned out to be! Between 75 and 85 people showed up to this monthly gathering in September, October, and November. A different speaker spoke each night. Community building questions brought people into conversation. Kids were able to roam through the Greenhouse without parents being overly concerned about their movement or noise level. People accepted the invitation to step forward to lead in new ways. Samantha Crawford did an outstanding job of leading music. The relaxed atmosphere allowed us to engage our faith in a different way. And...the snacks were often outstanding.

The goal of "Worship at the Greenhouse" was to reengage our younger families in a distinctly Christian community. This goal was met...and then some. Greenhouse worship became a place of genuine connection between the generations. It was awesome!

After 3 meaningful experiences, the question that has to be asked (and answered) is this: now what? I've spent a good deal of time over several weeks wrestling with the "now what?" question. I have vacillated from wondering if Worship at the Greenhouse might be sustainable as a monthly or bimonthly event, to wondering about my own ability to take on another regular worship service.

In conversation with staff, the executive committee, the council, Lindsey, and after much prayer and reflection, I've come to the conclusion that, at this time, Worship at the Greenhouse is best utilized as an occasional opportunity for Christian community and worship. To look at the 2024 calendar is to see some significant events that will take time and energy. The 150th celebration begins with a special worship service in May of 2024, continues with monthly events thereafter, and concludes with a special meal at Fox Hill at the end of September.

Lent begins early this year, with Ash Wednesday on February 14th.

I will be teaching "Zion 101" on the Sunday's of Lent, inviting a growing number of visitors and new members to participate.

There are 2 more confirmation retreats to plan for. The summer concert series on Saturday evenings will begin again in June and last until August. And, as a wise leader at Zion reminded me, there are those things that do not allow for planning, most specifically responding to health concerns and funerals. Our life at Zion will be full in 2024.

Even so, Zion is served well by the challenge of creating unique opportunities for Christian community. What would it look like if Worship at the Greenhouse was one of a series of unique opportunities to connect with Chrisitan community? What if there were several similar connecting points that brought people together in creative and lifegiving ways? I have wondered out loud about congregation wide, intergenerational Vacation Bible School. I have given some thought to intergenerational, family mission trips. What if Bible and a Brew made a comeback...a time to sit around a table informally at some restaurant and work through a book of the Bible together?

The possibilities really are endless. I'm excited about bringing back "Worship at the Greenhouse" at some point in 2024. I'm just as excited to imagine what we might create together, that Christian community might be built and sustained. Here's to a new year, full of new possibilities, in service of the one who makes all things new.

Each year, in addition to tasks that always need to be completed, I work with Pastor Scott to write a few ministry goals. Before 2024 gets too far underway, I would like to take a moment and let you know what happened with the goals set for ministry last year:

Goal 1: Facilitate a discussion group focusing on the topic of generosity. Result: I facilitated a 5-week study on the topic of generosity. We met July 10-August 7, and there were 9 participants. The group was small, but those who attended reported that their thoughts were provoked toward generosity and I felt that we had some really in-depth discussions.

Goal 2: Arrange for six different ministries to be highlighted (explained and prayed for) during worship services throughout the year. Result: Seven ministries were highlighted during the year: Safe Families, Evangelism, Outreach, Funeral Luncheon Ministry, Fellowship, Kids Hope, and Stitchery. This allowed congregation members to hear from people leading different ministries and introduced little known aspects of each ministry. There are


many more ministries we could highlight and expect that this practice will continue, although probably not as often as it was done in 2023.

Goal 3: Hold at least one connection meeting per month for the purposes of getting to know those new to our congregation, answering ministry questions, and offering information each might find valuable in connecting to the congregation. Result: I met with fourteen people. Some of those I talked with were new to Zion and looking for a way to feel more connected and become part of the work we do together. Some have been worshiping with us for a while, but are still feeling on the fringes of our congregational life. I loved talking with each and every one of them and expect to continue these meetings as a normal part of what I do each year. Pastor Scott and I have already talked about ministry goals for 2024. There will be more about that coming next month.

Prayer beside the bedside of a departing loved one fills the mind and heart silently. The feelings of the words "I love you" silently fill one's heart with their meaning.


All sounds of silence......




