

### Thoughts from Pastor Scott



#### Sabbath Rest

I have begun talking about a sabbatical again. Many of you remember that my first attempt at a sabbatical ended with a worldwide pandemic exactly 1 month before I was set to be away. I postponed my sabbatical for a month when covid hit. A few weeks later I realized it simply wouldn't happen. Some asked me when I'd get back to the possibility. But as soon as the question was asked, life began to happen as we came out of the pandemic, Lindsey was pregnant, Fiia spent 60 days in the NICU, Dezi was launched into adulthood, and life slowly began to find a rhythm again over the course of several years. 5 years after that first attempt, I've initiated a second conversation about a sabbatical. I have promised that if this attempt causes another worldwide pandemic, I'll never mention the word again.

Many of you may remember that our synod suggests a sabbatical be offered to pastors every 5-7 years. A sabbatical is not a vacation. Rather, it is a time of renewal (typically 3-4 months) for both the pastor and the congregation. I have begun to think about this time of renewal with the question the Lilly foundation asks of pastors in their sabbatical grant applications: "What would make your heart sing?" It's a great question. It's a question that opens up possibilities which may otherwise remain hidden. It's a question that leads to reflection on joy, love, renewal, and gratitude. It's a question that will continue to center my thinking and our conversation.

A sabbatical isn't just about the pastor. The Lilly foundation is clear that just as a sabbatical is about the pastor finding renewal, so too is the congregation given an opportunity for renewal. Congregational leaders and I will be talking about what renewal for Zion may look like during my proposed sabbatical. How will Zion join me in being renewed?

I know that many people, in many different vocations, do not have the opportunity for a sabbatical even though they need one, and even as they likely deserve one. I do not take for granted the gift Zion has given me in exploring the possibility of being away for an extended period of time to find renewal. I confess that I am no more deserving of a sabbatical than most of you. I receive this possibility as nothing less than an act of grace to me from Zion.

Finally, there is a lot going on around here at the moment: the 150th anniversary of Zion, estate gift decisions, many more staff than when I arrived 15 years ago, and the regular activities that provide a center for our life together. In some ways I lament providing another major initiative for our leaders to work through. However, I suspect I will lead better in the year to come, and in the year following the sabbatical, than I otherwise would. This feels like the right time to have the conversation. And so it begins...again.

Recently, the quality of warmth in a church was the topic of discussion during a book study that the office staff was completing together. It turns out that it is very important for visitors and young people to feel that the congregation is inviting and caring. According to the book, warmth is one of the most effective indicators as to whether your congregation will maintain and acquire members-especially young adults and teens. Just making eye contact and smiling matters. Showing interest in items a child may have with them or asking about an activity you know someone is interested in matters. I've seen several people at Zion make it a point to strike up a conversation with others that they don't recognize or know very well, and that goes a long way in creating an atmosphere of warmth. A more organized way that we can create a welcoming feeling is by greeting people as they enter the building. To that end, I am working to build a new roster of greeters. The job of the greeters will be as it was before we lost them during the pandemic-to arrive about 20 minutes before worship each Sunday to stand at the doors and greet people as they come in. Greeters will also provide an obvious person who can offer help for visitors who need to know things like where to hang their coat or where the bathroom is located. If you would like to help be a welcoming presence at Zion, let me know that you would like to be on the greeter roster. It is my hope that we can continue to build on a good thing that we already have going and find new ways to make everyone feel as valued and welcome as possible.


#### Buy a chick and feed the hungry!

## HELPIING SALAVATION ARMY WITH LUNCH FOR THE UNHOUSED

The Outreach Committee would like to start a new program that would help Salvation Army provide lunch once a month for the unhoused in our community. The Salvation Army provides a warming area and lunch daily to the unhoused people in our area. They could use our help. We would like to provide a lunch once a month to be served at Salvation Army.

Teams of 4 people would be formed for each month. These people would communicate with each other to decide on a menu for their month. Ideas for lunch could be chili and rolls, soup and salad, spaghetti and garlic bread, sloppy joes and chips, macaroni and cheese, hot dogs and fries, or pizza. Dessert for each lunch would also be welcomed. These items do not have to be homemade. Workers at Salvation Army will heat up or prepare the food. Prepared frozen items like soups, meatballs, sloppy joes, and taco meat from Gordon Foods work fine. Each team is asked to provide food for 30-40 people.

We have selected the third Wednesday of the month to provide the lunch. Items are to be dropped off at Salvation Army on Wright Street the Tuesday before.

We will be grouping people in fours to form teams. You may indicate people you would like to work with on a team. If we could get a good number of people to participate, a team would only have to provide lunch once a year.




